REFLECTIONS FROM FR. JOHN HEALY

Is. 60: 1-6

"Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you. See, darkness covers the earth, and thick clouds cover the peoples; but upon you the Lord shines, and over you appears his glory. Nations



shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance..."

Father, these early days of January are a strange mixture of new hope and sadness, of new beginnings and old fears and discouragements, of thankfulness for the gift of time and fear that time can also be a thief. The dull, cold, rainy, foggy days are an external reminder of what may be within us; discouragement, doubt, fear, pain. The holiday of great hope has gone, and we still have our sickness, our depression, our disagreements, our faults and sins. We may be disillusioned after the bright promise of the Christmas season. But, the real Christmas message is with us every day, because it is about a God who knows and feels our human pain, a God who loves us through our human frailty, a God we can now call "Abba" or Daddy.

This is the time of Epiphany - a time of three wise men being led by a star to the greatest light this world has ever known, to the greatest love we could ever yearn or hunger for, a love that is unconditional. That light wasn't dimmed by the darkness of the stable or the world. That love was not lessened by rejection, coldness, poverty and disappointment. That light of Christ is still strong. That love is very near. May we have the wisdom to seek it. May it brighten up our New Year with a sense of hope and encouragement. May it surround us tonight and enable us to have a peaceful, refreshing sleep. Amen.
